There we will take part in the annual festival at Genolhac which tells of the struggle of the Huguenots to gain recognition and freedom after the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685.

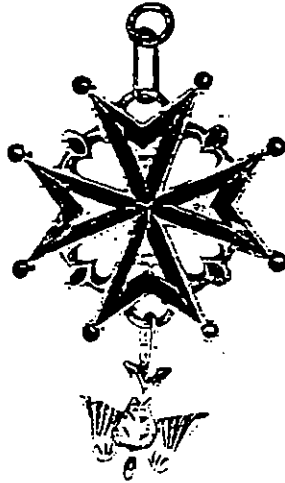
A special pageant will be held and the recognition of the BFA bronze plaque which will be placed on the original house in which Jean Pierre (John Peter) Bondurant lived until 1697. Please plan to join us on this historic trip. It will be a "trip of a lifetime."

The bronze plaque to mark Jean Peter Bondurant's French home will cost approximately \$1,000, and donations are needed to cover this expense. This is the final text of our plaque:

### JEAN-PIERRE BONDURANT

1676 - 1734

Fils de Jean-Pierre Bondurant et de Gabrielle Barjon, huguenots de Génolhac. Pharmacien de son état - en 1697 il est parti en Suisse, puis en Angleterre, et enfin en Virginie (États-Unis) où il y était médecin.



### JOHN PETER BONDURANT

1676 - 1734

He was born here of Huguenot parents - Jean-Pierre Bondurant and Gabrielle De Barjon. He was trained as an apothecary - in 1697 he left for Switzerland, then England, and finally to Virginia (United States) where he was a physician.

**THE TRIP OF A LIFETIME!**

Our Secretary, Mrs. Gretchen Bondurant, has arranged with Mount Vernon Travel, Inc., for the trip to view our ancestors' homes, and unveil the plaque at Genolhac. Here is a tentative schedule:

**MONDAY, August 16, 1993.** Rendezvous at Dulles Airport, Washington, DC, and fly to Paris on AIR FRANCE.

**TUESDAY, August 17, 1993.** Arrive at de Gaulle Airport, Paris, in the morning. Half-day sightseeing tour of Paris, then take the TGV, France's "fast train," to Avignon. Stay in Hotel Mercure in Avignon for the night.

**WEDNESDAY, August 18, 1993.** Sightsee at Avignon, and Nimes; bus to Ales, where we will stay in Hotel Mercure (our headquarters) for four nights.

**THURSDAY, August 19, 1993.** By bus to Barre des Cevennes, Villefort, and Mialet (the Huguenot Museum). Return to Ales.

**FRIDAY, August 20, 1993.** By bus to Cougossat, Chateau Castanet, and Genolhac for the festival.

**SATURDAY, August 21, 1993.** By bus to Genolhac, where plaque will be unveiled.

**SUNDAY, August 22, 1993.** Depart Ales by bus for Avignon. Take the TVG train back to Paris. Stay in Paris overnight at the Hotel Residence Monceau.

**MONDAY, August 23, 1993.** Depart from de Gaulle Airport, Paris, for Dulles Airport, and plane connections to our homes.

**AIR FRANCE Roundtrip air fare from Dulles to de Gaulle airports - \$952.55. Fare must be paid by June 1, 1993, and can be paid by check or credit card.**

**LAND PACKAGE, arranged through Jet Vacations, is \$857.45, and must be paid by check, or money order, but not by credit card, by June 1. This price is based on double occupancy; the single supplement is \$231 per person.**

The Land Package includes:

Round trip transfers to and from the airport in France.

Half-day Paris city sightseeing tour.

TGV First-class rail pass to Avignon.

Bus and bi-lingual driver at our disposal from our arrival in Avignon to departure.

All taxes and service charges.

Entrance fees are included for all guided tours; as are the expenses of the driver. Some modification of the itinerary may be necessary depending on the scheduled hours of operation of the various facilities.

Hotels: Hotel Mercure, Avignon, one night with continental breakfast.

Hotel Mercure, Ales, four nights with continental breakfast.

Hotel Residence Monceau, Paris, one night with continental breakfast.

(Similar hotels may be substituted based on availability.) All rooms have private bathroom facilities.

Estimated rates are inclusive of tax, service charges, and breakfast, as indicated. Please note that the rates may be adjusted if the size of the group changes, or in case of major currency fluctuation.

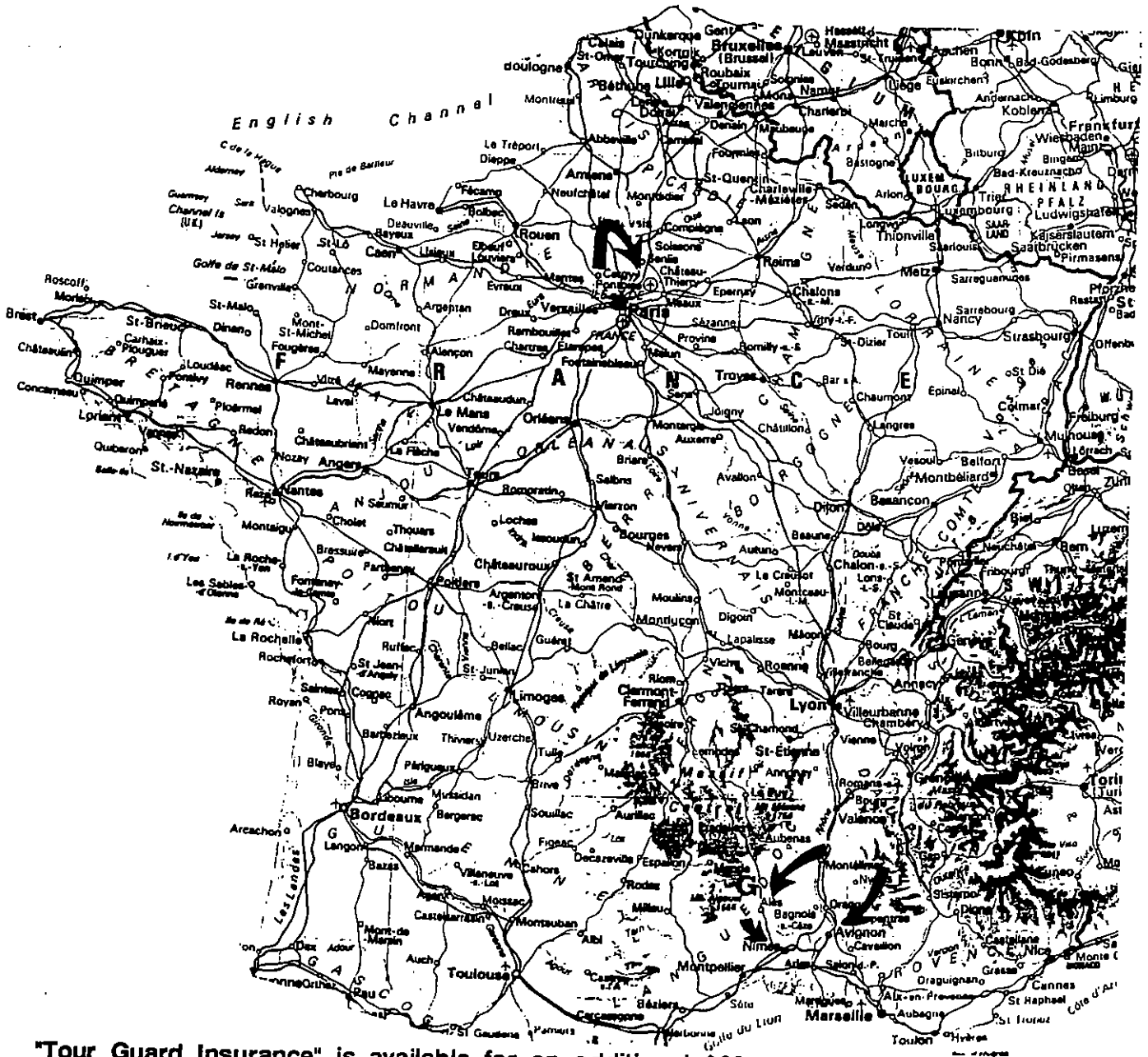

The agency can also book flights for you from your home to Dulles Airport to meet our party. Lunch and dinner costs are **NOT** included in this package. Allow \$50-60 per day for these meals.

**PASSPORTS ARE REQUIRED FOR EVERYONE.** Passport applications and instructions can be obtained from most post offices. Allow 8 weeks from application to delivery of the passport.

To cover additional costs of the trip which must be paid by the Association, a registration fee of \$50 per person should be sent to our Treasurer. Please fill in the form on the opposite page and mail it with your check before May 1st. A detailed itinerary will be sent you after that date.

If you're travelling alone, and need a roommate, write our President Ginny Wray, who has offered to "pair up" same-sex singles for this trip.

**WHAT TO SEE:** The area has Roman, and Medieval relics, museums, and great natural beauty. The view from Barre is breathtaking. There are buildings still standing in which our ancestors lived in the 15th and 16th centuries and perhaps earlier!

The Huguenot museum at Mialet is housed in the home of a Huguenot leader during the Camisard War - their rebellion against the king. Relics from their struggle are on display.

Sightseeing has been planned for the group, but is optional. If our numbers warrant it, we may be able to split into smaller groups designed for more (or less) activity.

Monsieur Jean-Pierre Olivier, the mayor of Genolhac, invited the U.S. consul at Marsailles to be present for the plaque unveiling. Monsieur Edouard Goulan-Sigwalt, who has done so much research on our Bondurant origins in France, and his wife, will come from Paris.

We'll get to see the house where Jean Pierre lived through the kindness of Madame Jean Francois Breton, its present owner.

**WHAT TO WEAR:** The weather is usually in the 80s and 90s but cools off at night, so summer clothing, with a sweater or jacket will be needed. Don't forget a raincoat (just in case). Walking shoes are appropriate for the cobblestone streets, and the rocky terrain at Barre.

**THANKS THAD!** We have at least one French-literate reader, Mr. Thad W. Greer, P.O. Box 36, St. Johns, AZ 85936-0036, 602/337-4068 who sent us a much better translation for the plaque than was published in our previous issue.

### **BONDURANT, IOWA, CENTENNIAL**

Mrs. Frances D. Meyer, P.O. Box 3088, Savannah, GA 31421, a descendant of LITTLEBERRY BONDURANT, sent copies of a commemorative book produced by the town of Bondurant, Iowa. Its founder was ALEXANDER CONLEY BONDURANT who at the age of 28, in 1857 left the family farm in Sangamon Co., IL and joined a tide of pioneers travelling to Iowa.

Finding a lovely spot, he made a claim to 320 acres in Section 31 of Franklin Township. It is reported that he paid only \$1.25 per acre! He cleared his land with a team of oxen, and laid the foundation of what became the largest holding in the county. Before his death he had gathered in between 2,000 and 3,000 acres.

He donated right-of-way for the railroad, a building site for a Christian Church, and free town lots to prospective residents who agreed to build a commercial structure in the new town. The town was called "Bondurant" and was laid out by A.C. and M.M. Bondurant in 1884, and incorporated in 1897. Alexander was born in Sangamon Co., IL 9-1-1829, the son of JOSEPH BONDURANT and MARTHA THARP, both natives of KY. By 1861 Alexander was well established and married MARGARET MARILLA BROOKS. They were parents of 8 children:

Alexander Conley, Jr.

Alexander "was a public spirited and liberal supporter of good works. He was a substantial donor to Drake University, ardent friend and honored trustee of that institution."

He died 9-17-1899 at the age of 70, and was buried in the town cemetery at Bondurant, Iowa. His large frame home was destroyed by fire in 1917.

### BONDURANT LORE

Mr. William Al Bundrant, 1400 Candlelight Dr., #179, Eugene, OR 97402-1438 shared his memories of some of his relatives.

"Back in the late 1930s I corresponded with my Great Aunt Mary Lucinda (Bundrant) Millican. I even saw her in 1941 when my wife and I went to Texas to bring my parents and young sister back to Oregon. We stopped off in Plainview, Texas, to visit Great Aunt Saletha and Great Aunt Mary was staying with her but was sick in bed. She looked just like she did in a picture I had of her sitting on a doorstep looking off into space. She must have been close to 90 and her hair was black.

I remember the story my dad used to tell about her and her two small daughters living alone in New Mexico. They heard a noise up in the tree by the back door. Aunt Mary called out but no one answered. She got the double barreled shotgun, opened the door, pointed it up into the tree and let go with both barrels. Next morning they found a dead cougar or mountain lion lying dead under the tree.

I don't even remember how she and I began corresponding or when it ended. She lived in Silver City, New Mexico, then. I think she must have gotten me interested in my heritage. Dad always talked about ancestors. I don't remember where I got the copy of our lineage that Great Aunt Nancy Jane Bundrant Raines prepared for Cousin Minnie Mahalia Tucker Bundrant who married her cousin, James Elijah Bundrant and raised their family at Killeen near where my Great Great Grandmother settled when she brought all the youngsters to Texas, except, William, when her husband John passed away in 1850 in Waynesboro, TN.

In April 1949 my wife and I lost a son. A short time later I got a letter from Dr. William Claiborne Bundrant in Klamath Falls, OR; his daughter had sent him the obituary.

He very bluntly asked me, "Who the Hell are you?" Mom and Dad went down to visit him, and he came to Eugene a couple of times. He was the grandson of William who remained in Waynesboro [TN], and Dad was the grandson of Hardin Alexander who came to Texas with his mother, brothers and sisters.

He [Dr. W.C. Bundrant] told me the Bondurants had come from Alsace-Lorraine. He further told me that one Bondurant changed the way of spelling to the way we spell it, and that we who spell it Bundrant are all descended from him.

My Great Aunt Nancy Jane wrote that Thomas Bundrant, my GGG Grandfather was exiled from France for shooting a dog, and my GGG Grandmother Sarah Mackey was exiled from England for picking a plum, and that they met in Virginia in 1742 and were married. Others discredit this story because of all the Bondurants already there. No one can seem to pin Thomas to any specific Bondurant because there were so many of them in that era...."

### AGEE HERCULES BONDURANT

Mr. Robert E. BonDurant, 101 Worth Ave., Palm Beach, FL 33480 wants to confirm the family story, that his grandfather Agee Hercules BonDurant came from Canton, OH, not necessarily his birthplace, to a farm he purchased in Marshall Co., IN. He died at an early date "and I never knew him. Likewise with my grandmother. My father was only a baby at the time of his father's death, and he too has been gone for the past many years.

I cannot account for the use of the capital D in our spelling, but there must have been some reason," he concluded.

### MAXEY - BONDURANT

Mrs. Georgene Jurgensen, 910 Palmer Lane, Palm Harbor, FL 34685 has been working on her connection with the Bondurant family through a marriage between CHARLES MAXEY and ANNE BONDURANT in Buckingham Co., VA in 1764.

### BONDURANT - CHASTAIN

Ms. Pauline Word, Rt. 3 Box 63-A, Dillwyn, VA 23936 asks if anyone has come across records of one NOAH BONDURANT who m. MARTHA CHASTAIN. "I find Noah listed in the *AGEE BOOK* as the third child of REV. THOMAS BONDURANT." Another source listed him as the 5th child. "In all of the Chastain material I can not find any mention of Martha.

I get requests from others for Bondurant genealogy. My late husband was descended from Rev. Thomas Bondurant through one of his daughters," she added.

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Family notes written in a copy of Guthrie's *GEOGRAPHY*, by an unknown Buckingham Co. scribe, possibly Rev. Rane Chastain, Jr. has the marriage record you are missing. "Noah Bondurant to Patsy Chastain. Sept. 10th 1807."

Since Patsy is a nickname often used for Martha, this is probably the marriage.

This is included in *BUCKINGHAM COUNTY, VA, CHURCH AND MARRIAGE RECORDS 1764-1822*, which we compiled from this manuscript, a ministerial journal belonging to Rev. Rane Chastain, and legislative petitions, all relating to Buckingham Co.'s citizens. The paperback book, 87 pages with a full name index, is available from HERITAGE PAPERS, P.O. **DAR PATRIOT INDEX, CORRECTED**

From *DAR MAGAZINE*, Oct. 1992: Thomas Smith, born ca. 1750, d. 2-27-1829 was a private in VA, Revolutionary service. His marriage was recorded to CUZZY BONDURANT, whose correct name was KEZIAH BUNDRANT or BONDURANT.

I have located a cousin in St. Joseph, LA, who by coincidence is named Mary Bondurant. She advises she has family Bibles and other documents which she will copy and forward after the holidays are over. We will gladly share our information if it is pertinent to your work," he offered.

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Buried in the Natchez Cemetery if your missing man, Daniel Maxey Bondurant (1779 - 1837). Who his parents were is still to be discovered.

**BONDURANT - THARP**

Mr. Roger R. Connelly, 5967 Rosinante Run, Columbia, MD 21045 is not a direct descendant, but two Bondurants married into his direct line. He requests information on JOSEPH BONDURANT, b. 9-15-1801 Bedford Co., VA, and DRURY or DURY BONDURANT, perhaps Joseph's brother. Joseph was the son of THOMAS BONDURANT and MARGARET DRURY. Joseph and Drury married two THARP sisters in Boone Co., KY.

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** My information is that Drury married Jane Tharp, and Martha (Patsy) Tharp (1805-1892) married Joseph. The men are identified as brothers.

#### **PENNINGTON - BONDURANT**

Ms. Julia G. Switlick, P.O. Box 133, Maitland, FL 32751 has been researching her McGehee ancestors, and found that William McGehee's dau. Amanda McGehee m. William Terry of Talladega, AL. Their dau. Amanda V. Terry m. a TN attorney named Graves Pennington, Jr., the son of Graves Pennington, Sr. and MARTHA M. BONDURANT.

"If you are indeed related to Martha M. Bondurant Pennington, I will be happy to send you what little information I have on her."

#### **BONDURANT - SALLEE**

Mr. Gary Frank Sallee, 19912 Fernglan Dr., Yorba Linda, CA 92686-6014, 714/970-2864 wrote, "From the little information I have access to, it appears that Bondurants have married into the Salle family name at least twice. That implies that there is some common history.

Enclosed is a sample from the family chart that I am preparing for my cousins. These cousins, descendants of my g grandfather Lycurgus Ashbrook (L.A.) Sallee, now take 30 pages of this vertical line type of chart. And I am still searching for more.

Fortunately, about a hundred old letters and photos have been preserved in the L.A. Sallee family. Some date back to 1860. Several pertain to the Civil War experience of L.A. Sallee and his three brothers.

As part of finding the Salle family history, I am trying to find books that pertain to the Huguenot migration and emigration. Enclosed is a list of books that I have seen referenced in other documents. These books seem to be unheard of on the West Coast. Can you suggest a source for any of these books? Also, can you suggest any other Huguenot books that are currently available?"

The two marriages he mentioned were those of PIERRE or PETER SALLE (1705-1752) to FRANCES JANE or FRANCOISE BONDURANT, daughter of Jean Pierre Bondurant the emigrant.

And MARTHA (Patty) BONDURANT (1777 Madison Co., VA - before 1860) to HENRY SALLE, b. 3-18-1768, m. Buckingham or Montgomery Co., VA.

Ms. Johnnie Lea Moffitt, 307 Fleetwood Court, Arlington, TX 76014 wants to clear up conflicting information on family marriages.

According to *AYRES KIN AND KIN TO KIN*, by Miss Nellie F. Ayres, p. 75 it states: "According to Mr. S.D. Maxey ... William Salle, son of Abraham and Magdalen, married in 1727 ELIZABETH BONDURANT, born 1709, d. 1739....

William Salle, born 5-8-1734 married JANE BONDURANT, daughter of JOHN PETER BONDURANT. Jane Salle, born 1761, married John Hales Ayres."

*THE HUGUENOT*, publication 24, p. 128 stated that William Salle m. Elizabeth Givaudan [Gevondan], not Bondurant, b. 1709, d. 1739.

Has anyone proof that William Salle m. Jane Bondurant, or that their dau. Jane Salle m. John Hales Ayres.

Jane Bondurant was the dau. of John Peter Bondurant [John Bondurant, Sr.] and Sarah Rachel Taylor Moseley.

#### **BONDURANT - WILLIAMS**

Mrs. Carol D. Veal, 82 Bloomingdale Rd., Quaker Hill, Ct. 06375 is not a direct descendant of Jean Pierre, but wants information on Bondurants who married into her Williams family.

"I am interested in the Bondurants who were in AL about 1850 and married into the WILLIAMS and BURFORD families of Greene, Hale, and Perry Cos. I would appreciate any assistance and suggestions.

1. My grandfather's sister Cornelia M. Williams was born in AL in 1848, and married a Mr. Bondurant. No further information on either.



2. Cornelia's sister, Mary Jane Williams, born 4-4-1840, was the 2nd wife of William D. Burford. His first wife was a Miss Bondurant, probably Nancy H. Bondurant, the daughter of Thomas and Mary Bondurant. I have the 1850 census of Perry Co., AL, records of Thomas and family, also have copied the tombstones of the Bondurants in the cemetery at Uniontown.

3. Cornelia Burford, daughter of Mary Jane Williams and William D. Burford above, married William Bondurant, who was a nephew of Miss Bondurant, the first wife of William D. Burford. When William Bondurant's first wife died, he married her sister Maggie Burford.

We have gathered a lot of records on the Williams family including siblings of Cornelia and Mary Jane, descendants, parents, and ancestors."
