

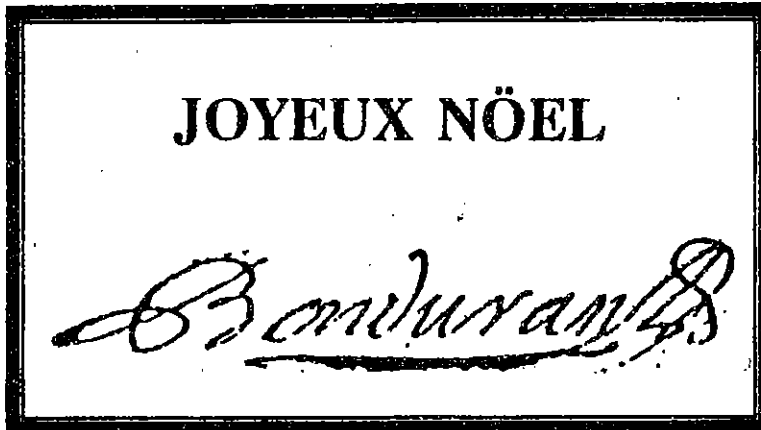

MINUTES OF THE BONDURANT FAMILY ASSOCIATION MEETING

October 24-25, 1997, Holiday Inn, Louisville, KY

The annual Bondurant Family Association meeting was held October 24-25, 1997, at the Holiday Inn (downtown), in Louisville, Kentucky. Sixty-four members, and guests from twelve states (AL, CO, FL, GA, IN, KY, MD, OH, OR, TN, TX, and VA) registered during the meeting.

FRIDAY, OCT. 24. The meeting began on Friday evening with "Meet Your Kin." Theresa and John Tyree Bondurant welcomed the group and gave details for the weekend. Sign-up sheets for the dinner Saturday night at their home, including a special tour of the Zachary Taylor house, were passed around. John called attention to the information packets and briefly went over sightseeing possibilities including the Hillerich and Bradsby Bat Museum, the Kentucky Derby Museum, and Locust Grove historic home. Members then introduced themselves, identified their branch of the family, and shared some of their family history and genealogical work. Approximately 75 persons were present.

SATURDAY, OCT. 25. John Tyree Bondurant opened the meeting and called on Rev. Wayne Bondurant for the opening invocation.

John then introduced Rev. Alice Bondurant Scott. She shared information on tracing her family to Buckingham County, VA.

HIGHLIGHTS OF ALICE BONDURANT SCOTT'S SPEECH

JOHN WESLEY BONDURANT was born in Bedford County, VA, whose son LEWIS BOURBON BONDURANT "was part of the movement which swept across the great eastern mountains to settle in Kentucky. Census records show that at least part of his father's family came along with him, including his father John Wesley.

Lewis Bourbon married LYDIA ANN WEBB, and their home became the ancestral home of our Bondurants in Brandenburg, Kentucky.... died of cholera at the age of 36. He was buried in the Henry Cemetery a few miles outside of Brandenburg. The Henry family had married into the Bondurant family, and Lewis Bourbon had gone to visit the home of Henry relatives when he became ill.

Lewis Bourbon [Bondurant] was the father of several children. Briefly, they were:

1. Nancy or Nannie who married HARVEY LESLIE.
2. Ellen who married JOSEPH BOARD.
3. Mary.
4. James.
5. John who married ELIZABETH ELDER.
6. George who lived only three years.
7. Ezekial (Zeke) who joined the Union Army during the Civil War, and was killed in action at Knoxville".
8. Elisha Richard married 1st LUCINDA FENWICK of Union Co., 2nd LAURA GAREY of Indiana.
9. Carlton Webb (Carl) married NANCY ELIZABETH WALLER in Union Co.

Elisha Richard Bondurant and Lucinda had one child, James Henry Bondurant, who was only 10 months old when his mother died. She was buried in St. Vincent's Cemetery in Union Co.

Elisha returned with his baby son to the Bondurant's home. Later Elisha remarried Laura Garey, and had 7 children: Annie Almetta, Carlton Webb, Clay, Imogene, William Harvey, Elisha Richard II, and Bourbon Patch.

James Henry Bondurant served in the Kentucky Senate, and was a Highway Commissioner. His wife

MINNIE ALICE BLAND was a descendant of the Bland family of Virginia. James Henry was also an active member of the Brandenburg Methodist Church, which he served in many offices.

Children of James Henry and Minnie Bondurant were: James William, Richard Bland, Mildred Alice, Martha Scott, and Lewis Gardner.

James William Bondurant and Zula Edna Powell were parents of six: Minnie Alice SCOTT, Peggy Marie PENAS, James Elliott, Mary Edna JONES, Joseph Alfred, and Eleanor Jeanetta NEWMAN. James William, a Brandenburg businessman, was active in the Baptist Church.

Mildred Alice Bondurant married WILLIAM R. GENTRY, SR., and had children: William R., Jr., and Alice Elizabeth WILLIAMS.

"The other children of James Henry Bondurant have no direct descendants," added Mrs. Scott.

DARBY BONDURANT CORRECTION

Thanks to Thad Greer, 535 S Alma School Rd. #64, Mesa, AZ 85210-1048, who caught my error in the previous issue. Darby didn't live to be 172 years old, nor was his wife Ruth Agee 41 when they married. These are the dates Thad believes to be correct.

DARBY BONDURANT born 1-7-1749 VA, died 11-1-1828, Buckingham Co., VA, married 10-16-1771 VA. Son of John Bondurant [not John Peter] and Mrs. Sarah Rachel Taylor Moseley.

Darby's 1st wife was RUTH AGEE born 1-2-1748 Buckingham [not yet formed; was Albemarle Co., VA], died 12-1-1781 in Buckingham Co. She was the daughter of JAMES AGEE and MARY ELIZABETH FORD.

Children by Ruth Agee:

1. Benjamin (1773-1845) buried near Dresden, Weakley Co., TN, married SARAH EAST MOSELEY
2. Joseph born 4-22-1774 VA.
3. David (1775-1856) married POLLY GARRETT.
4. Mary M. (1778-1837) married DAVID THOMAS.
5. James born 5-23-1779, married 12-27-1802 CHLOE GARRETT.

Darby's 2nd wife was LUCY HALL, whom he married 6-12-1786 in Buckingham Co., VA. Children by Lucy Hall:

6. Samuel born 6-26-1789.
7. Thomas M[oseley] born 5-16-1792 Buckingham Co., VA. [builder of "Variety Shade"]

Thad also believes that there was a marriage made by John Bondurant, son of Jean Pierre, to SARAH DARBY (1714-1744) who was the mother of Joel b. 1742, Benjamin b. 1751, and David b. 1754, all in VA.

EDITOR'S NOTE: There is a big problem with the Sarah Darby marriage; her death date is given between the births of sons Joel and Benjamin. How can this be explained, or is the death date wrong? Sarah Taylor Moseley's children are said to have been born in 1737 (John), 1740 (Richard), 1748 (Thomas), 1749 (Darby), yet Joel (above) was born in 1742, then Benjamin (1751) and David (1754). Is there any legal evidence to prove, or even suggest, that there were two wives named Sarah?

HELP FROM CYBERSPACE ...

SARAH BONDURANT, buried in Sinking Spring Cemetery, Abingdon, Washington Co., VA, died 12-29-1857. About 1821 in Franklin Co., VA, she married REGNAL BUTT, born 8-10-1802 Berkeley Co., VA, d. after 1870 Washington Co., VA.

Their children were: Thomas J., Frances, Sarah, James H., Mary, John W., Henry Clay, and Joseph M. Butt.
