


Genetic Genealogy for Families of Color

Susan Neese will be giving a presentation at the annual meeting in October that will focus on the journeys of five Bondurant Families of Color as they pursue information on their family histories. Their triumphs and continued challenges will be explored.

Questions such as the following will be addressed: How did they come by the Bondurant surname? Were they enslaved before the Emancipation Proclamation of 1863, and if so, have their owners been identified? Were they "free people of color," and if so, how did they obtain their freedom? Are they genetically related to other people of Bondurant ancestry? Who was their earliest known Bondurant ancestor? How has DNA testing helped in answering these questions?



It is planned that the presentations at this year's meeting will be recorded and made available on the BFA webpage, to make this information available to future researchers.



The Westward Migration of the Bondurant Family *The First Four Generations*

A virtual presentation prepared and given by David Bondurant


David Bondurant gave this virtual presentation on August 14, 2021, via Zoom. It is now available on the Virtual Meetings webpage of the BFA website to watch any time! <http://bondurant-family.org/styled-23/>

It describes the early migration of the Bondurant family in Virginia, from Jean Pierre's first 200-acres in Matoaca to his 400-acres in Manakin, Virginia. His land was not far from where he is believed to be buried in Powhatan, Virginia, on land that belonged to his daughter Ann Ford's husband, James Ford (also known as Jacques Faure). We follow the migration of Jean Pierre's three sons and his daughter Ann to Buckingham County, Virginia, and learn where their land holdings were in that county.

We learn more about where they lived and went to church, including some prominent Bondurant houses in the county (Variety Shade, Perry Hill). Did you know about a Bondurant Gold Mine? And what about William Bondurant's ownership in the Muddy Creek Mill, now a national historic site?

We know that while some members of the third and fourth generations of the Bondurant family stayed in Buckingham County, Virginia, many went west, the majority traveling via the Cumberland Gap into Kentucky and beyond.

David has plans for future programs about the families of those descendants and their impact on the expansion of our country.

THE MUSE OF FREEDOM

The Muse of Freedom is a fictional tale of young Jehan BonDurant, *seigneur du Cougoussac*, and his mystical muse. Jehan inherits an estate along with a legacy of secrets rooted in the suppression his Huguenot ancestors faced. A dose of magic, myth, and romance, have been distilled and blended with captivating settings as inspirational backdrops for this story of hope when courage, tenacity, transcendent vision, and the power of love are called upon to overcome oppression and dangerous divisions.

In the mysterious Cévennes mountains of southern France 1695—a land deeply divided by King Louis XIV's hunger for religious persecution and lust for wealth, war, and tariffs—Jehan BonDurant must decide where his loyalties lie. His is a world filled with divisions, rivalries, danger, death, and love—of hard choices and hard lessons learned.

Forcibly taken from his Protestant Huguenot parents as a child, Jehan had been converted and raised in a Dominican Catholic convent. Upon his release, he inherits a Seigneurie, along with a legacy of secrets rooted in the years of suppression, betrayal, and hardship his Protestant ancestors faced. Training to be an apothecary under his controlling older cousin André's watchful eye, he has hopes of attending medical school. But renewed unrest, led by the king's Intendant Basville and his dragonnades, shatters Jehan's dreams.

Jehan is outraged by the brutality he witnesses, and perplexed by strange cryptic symbols, secret meetings, and the celestial harmonies echoing throughout the mountains. He struggles with the divisiveness and destruction, wondering if he should flee along with thousands of other refugees, or stifle his longing for freedom and stay.

His world is turned around when he meets Amelia Auvrey, a young, free spirited, holy woman healer. She reveals forgotten ancient mysteries, helping him discover unconditional love, and becoming the motivation in his quest for truth and freedom by inspiring the courage, tenacity, and transcendent vision he needs to overcome religious and political oppression.

An unmistakable connection between the two has Amelia retreating to make decisions of her own. Does she commit to her vow of poverty and chastity, or open to her heart's desire? Will Jehan decide to risk the perilous journey out of his cherished homeland, with or without her, or stay to face an epidemic of hatred and death?

It is inspired by the real-life story, of Jean Pierre Bondurant 1677-1734/5, a young *nouveau converti* Catholic nobleman from the Cévennes mountains of Languedoc in Occitania, France, during a tumultuous time of religious persecutions under the reign of Louis XIV.

Please note that this is a work of historical fiction. Names, characters, places, and incidents either are the product of the author's imagination or used fictitiously, and any resemblance to actual persons, living or dead, business establishments, events or locales is entirely coincidental. It is inspired by true events and has been meticulously researched, offering the reader an authentic experience of the times.

The Bondurants' First Years in Virginia
